He created this model while working for the Council for Civic Action in Orange County where he organized the farm workers in the Latino Community to end the segregation of the schools. His organizing methods are used by labor and community organizations all over the world.

He had so much faith in the power of ordinary people and his method of organizing made it easy for everyone to participate. The involvement at the grass roots level provided the organizing experiences to develop leadership development. If you were fortunate enough to be instructed by Fred, the lessons he taught were not only about organizing but also about leading a moral life of serving others to make a better world. Our country has benefited from the work that Fred Ross, Sr. and the leadership he inspired and taught.
